Reflections from Father James

“DO YOU KNOW CHRIST?”

At a time when all knowledge is prized, when the number of college graduates is at an all time high, we find that most people, including many Christians of various stripes still remain ignorant about attaining a knowledge of who Christ is. Not to know, to really know Jesus is a great tragedy. And what is perhaps even more tragic is what ignorance of Jesus does not to him, but to us the ignorant.

Although by and large people were aware of his sacrifice on the cross and by and large were grateful to the Crucified one, they didn't think about him very much, only talked to him mostly on Sundays. Or as a last resort when they couldn't solve their many problems. You see there was so much else to do, places to see, people to meet that they found no time for him. It got so bad that a concerned Christian in a large city in England wrote the following prose:

When Jesus came to Golgotha
they hanged him on a tree.
They drove great nails through hands and
feet and made their calvary.
They crowned him with a crown of thorns:
Red were his wounds and deep.
For those were crude and cruel days.
And human flesh was cheap.

When Jesus came to Birmingham

They simply passed him by,
They never hurt a hair of him;
They only let him die.
For men had grown more tender,
They would not cause him pain.
They only passed him down the street
And left him in the rain.

Still Jesus cried “forgive them,
for they know not what they do!”
And still it rained a winter rain,
that drenched him through and through
The crowds went home and left the streets
without a soul to see,
And Jesus crouched against a wall
and cried for Calvary.

When we realize who Jesus is, it strikes us how frightful a loss it is not to know him. Not simply his biography the way we know Caesar, Shakespeare, Plato or Lincoln. Not to know ABOUT him but to know him as our brother.....our life.....our God. John the Evangelist in his first letter declares “by this we may be sure that we know him, if we keep His commandments.” By this John was answering those who claimed to know God but did not take too seriously the ethical demands that genuine religion makes on us. If anyone wants to test how well you know God, look to your obedience. How seriously do you take what he asks of you?

But still the basic question remains unanswered,

“DO YOU KNOW CHRIST?”

what does it mean to “know” God, to “know” Jesus? In the fourth gospel of John Jesus declares “now this is eternal life, that they know you the one true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ.” To know Jesus according to John is to be “in Him”, to “abide in him.” It is his presence in us and our presence in him. That’s eternal life.

This kind of knowing is found constantly in the early writers especially the Greek Fathers. St. Gregory of Nyssa a bishop in the fourth century wrote that the goal or life of the mind is to know Christ. Gregory tells us that there is but one way ultimately to know God, and that is to be like him, to be in his image. Others would say we can know God through creation. But this type of knowledge even the wise of the world can attain. To really know God is to share in his holiness. And how do we participate in God’s holiness? By following him through faith, eyes closed, wherever he leads us and by opening our hearts to further and further submissiveness.

If to know Jesus is to experience him, if to know God is to share in his holiness, does God’s Word offer practical advice on how to go about it? Certainly! We know God and we experience him at the table of the Word and the table of his Body. When the sacred Scriptures are read in Church, it is God himself who speak to us. For this reason the celebrant reminds us to stand and attentively hear the word. Christ is present in the proclaimed word just as he is present in the blessed bread and wine.

At the table of his body we are confronted with a mystery and we bow low before it. And when we receive the “Gifts” which are no longer bread and wine, for they are now the very body and very blood of the Christ, risen and glorified,

yet forever human and divine We are thus uniquely joined to him and he to us. We become one with him and through him. Yes, we do know him in the breaking of the bread as did the disciples.

Friends, you will know him at the table of his word because heart will be speaking to heart. But in order to hear him, to experience him you must not be passive, but you must listen to the Lord the way the young listen to their favorite rock band; and the way aspiring athletes listen to their coach and emulate their favorite player.

Upon experiencing the Lord we must respond. Yes, respond by doing justice, by defending the poor and the needy, by showing compassion and generous concern for those who are hurting in one way or another. Then you will know the Christ, you will experience him and your whole being will be transfigured into the human being the Creator originally created.

“Help on the Way for Transfiguration”

On September 14th of every year, Orthodox Churches throughout the world celebrate the exaltation of the Holy Cross. The Cross that at one time was considered an instrument of torture, humiliation, degradation and death, has now become an instrument of deliverance, and the Universal symbol of victory over death and degradation. When we love, we expose ourselves and make ourselves totally vulnerable. The logic of the world teaches us that this is foolishness. Love is risky to be sure when we extend ourselves lovingly to others, we take the chance that our love will not be reciprocated, we are wounded at hurt. So what is the alternative? Should we never consider ourselves at risk to love at all? If we did this, then we can never truly and fully live. We would become prisoners of our own fear, sensitivities and insecurities. If God is love, and we are created in His image and likeness, then we must love. From His love, we received His being, through His love, we are sustained, and by His love we will be saved. Without love, there would be nothing.

Love is not cold, passive, timid, detached, self-containing, or apathetic. Love is warm, ecstatic, brave, caring and sacrificial. God is love. God wanted to share his joy, His love and all that He had with us. Love wants to create, to reach out, and share everything with everybody.

The Cross is a sign of the relationship between God and man, and man and man, now reconciled. Both the vertical relationship between God and man and the horizontal relationship between man and man has been restored upon the Cross, in the person of Jesus Christ who is both God and man. In his person on the vertical axis, He unites the divine and the human natures; in His person on the horizontal axis He unites all men of all times to one another. On the Cross, past and future are united and heaven and earth, meet in the eternal presence in the person of the God-man (Theanthropos) Jesus Christ. At the intersection of the horizontal and vertical planks of the Cross rests the son of God, the connection and

the nexus that gives everything meaning, purpose and understanding.

Old and new come together on the Cross. The New Man (Christ) redeems the Old Man, Adam. In Christ, past and future are merged, heaven and earth are united, and God and man are reconciled. In Christ, all is reunited, healed, saved and perfected. All this takes place at the Cross. God’s love for His creation and the “crown of His creation” man is given the fullest, most dramatic and unforgettable expression upon the Cross. The full extended magnitude of God’s love for us is made plain in the starkest, most graphic manner at the Cross. The vulnerability of Love is painfully manifest on the Cross.

In God’s wondrous manner, the crucifixion manifested God’s glory. God’s love is unlimited and invincible. We as Christians now worship the One True God Who shares all our suffering and redeems our nature. God is with us, God knows us, and God loves us. How far does God’s love reach? He loves us to the point of the Cross. The four corners of the Cross teach us that he loves the four corners of the world--His entire universe. His love is universal for all peoples, for all times.

Moses’ arms tired and began to fall when he made the sign of the Cross to deliver the Israel of Old from its enemies. Christ’s arms will never tire, for they are transfixed upon the Cross, and suspended not by men, but by the Love of God, the Father. Through the love of Christ, we, the New Israel, will be delivered from every enemy---even death, the last enemy. Implanted high on the hill of Golgotha, the Cross is our invincible standard, our unconquerable trophy, the pledge and promise of God’s everlasting love for us. Let us worship him at his footstool, His Cross implanted upon Golgotha for our salvation.

As for the Greek School, the Folk Dance Group and Sunday School, Father James will continue to administer these important programs.

This year we decided to separate J.O.Y. from H.O.P.E in order to provide an individual program tailored for each group. This will benefit our children more.

OUR YOUTH ADVISORS

Every successful youth activity depends on dedicated advisors who are willing to give of their time and talents to help kids. These men and women give unselfishly of themselves because they love children and for that we are truly grateful.

LITTLE ANGELS

(ages 3 and 4)

JOY is a ministry to children from 3rd through 6th grade. By adhering to the “ Four Circles” which include Worship, Fellowship, Service and Witness the children will come close to understanding the Church and thus encourage them to become active participants in the life of the Church.\

While the span from 3rd grade through 6th grade is a large one and while a 6th grader is at a completely different stage of development than the 3rd grader, there is much that they share in common.

The mission of JOY is to strengthen the relationship of young Orthodox Christians with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This ministry gives them the opportunity to become active sacramental participants in the life of the Body of Christ. A well-balanced JOY ministry program will provide activities that meet the needs of all the children in this ministry. For JOY ministry to be effective we need a high adult-to-child ratio. The ideal ratio is 1 adult for every 7 children which will enable these adults to provide appropriate direction and supervision fro the children participating.

G.O.Y.A.

(Greek Orthodox Youth of America)

Boys and girls between the ages of 12 and 18 are served by this group. This group has varied interests but they possess many similarities. A well-balanced program will keep their interest. We have planned what we consider to be such a program and we look to the input of the advisors. The G.O.Y.A. Basketball is an integral part of this ministry. This group requires at least six advisors. We are fortunate that we have George Stephens and Nancy Foxhall who have been advisors to GOYA and their experience will prove invaluable as we put together a balanced, interesting and fun program.

ALTAR BOYS

This group of boys serve the Lord within the Holy

Altar. This is truly a privilege and great honor to be in such a sanctified sphere. The boys who serve in the Ieron, the holiest part of our church, are truly invested with God’s bountiful grace. For this reason parents of children between the ages of 9 to 18 should encourage their children to serve in the Altar. We have several vacancies and we want to have 10 servers for each of our four teams. We especially solicit the services of our older teenagers, ages 16, 17 and 18 who can assist the younger and less experienced ones.. Again, please call either priest.

OUR ADVISORS

Every successful youth activity depends on dedicated advisors. These men and women give unselfishly of themselves, their time and talents, to minister to our kids and for that we are very grateful. We call upon those parents who may have children participating in our youth ministry to come forth and volunteer their valuable services. While we have some parents involved as advisors we call on other members, parents and non- parents, to assist with these youth programs. Please call either Fr. James or Fr. Nicholas if interested for details.

JR. CHOIR

Elsa Libowitz,, our most talented Music Director has been working with our Junior Choir for some time now. The kids do a great job singing the Liturgy about once a month. Our goal is to increase their number as well as the frequency of their liturgical participation. Here again parental guidance and encouragement will go a long ways to their children’s participation. Knowledge of Greek is not necessary. Those who have heard our children, are certainly pleased by the beauty of their melodious voices which they raise in praise of the Lord. ATTENTION YOUTH AND PARENTS

As we enter into the New Ecclesiastical Year, it is time once again to get our youth programs into full swing!

With the blessing of, and under the guidance, instruction and with the approval of our Pastor, Fr. James, I am pleased to offer programs and activities for all the youth of our parish from ages 2 thru 17, that will not only encompass the four circles of practice of our Orthodox Faith, which are Liturgia (worship), Martyria (witnessing of the Faith), Koinonia, (fellowship) and Diakonia (service) but will also provide fun and enjoyment for all! Additionally, we are in the process of developing a young adult program for young people between the ages of 18-35, which will be implemented sometime in January.

The Youth programs that we will begin the new Ecclesiastical Year are as follow:

GOYA (7-12 graders) will be meeting twice a month. One meeting will be a business/educational meeting, the second will be an outing / activity that will encompass one or more of the four core areas of practice of our faith as described above.

HOPE is the ministry that serves children in the **Kindergarten thru 2nd grade age category**. It

will include age-appropriate games, songs and music which are designed to convey the principles and teachings of our Orthodox Faith. This ministry will be meeting once each month on Saturday. More details will be sent out and announced later this month as to the specific time.

JOY is the ministry that serves children in the **3rd-6 grade age category**. It will include discussion, as well as arts and crafts again designed to convey the principles and teachings of our Orthodox Faith This ministry will also meet once a month on Saturdays.

Finally, I am please to announce that we will also be forming a **“little angels”** group which will serve **the 3-4 year olds**. This ministry is designed to better orient toddlers to the church environment, as well as to introduce them to the customs and traditions associated with our liturgical practices such as lighting candles, venerating icons, the lives and the roles of the Virgin Mary as well the Saints of our Church. Additionally, this group is designed to facilitate the integration of our toddlers into the subsequent age-appropriate ministries (HOPE, JOY, GOYA) This group will meet once a month, in the church proper. Again, letters will sent and announcements will be made orally and in writing as to the exact date and times.

I am very happy and excited about the upcoming programs for our youth and hope that I will have your full support.

Welcome back from your summer vacation and activities. With the summer months behind us, the return to our regular routines and all the events generally associated with the end of summer begin. We look forward to a busy fall here at St. John's with many events planned for all of us to enjoy.

I would like to thank Nancy Foxhall and GOYA for serving Sunday coffee during the month of July and August. It is very enjoyable sharing the coffee hour with our GOYIANS.

One of National Philoptochos most successful programs is The Children's Medical Fund Luncheon and this year our Ladies Philoptochos of the Metropolis of San Francisco will be hosting *the 11th Children's Medical Fund Luncheon on Saturday, November 10th at the Fairmont Hotel, Newport Beach.* This is the first time the luncheon will be held in our Metropolis and it is our hope to reach a giving level of \$500,000, of which over \$125,000 will be awarded throughout our Metropolis !

The Children's Medical Fund has made positive difference in the lives of children around the country in providing support for children dealing with life-threatening illnesses, including heart disease, AIDS, cancer, kidney, liver ailments, juvenile diabetes, etc. We have granted over \$206,000 exclusively for Orthodox Children. The Stewardship of St. Sophia and Her Three Daughters: SS. Faith, Hope, and Agape

September 17



“Your heavenly Lover, Jesus Christ, is eternal health, inexpressible beauty and life eternal. When your bodies are slain by torture, he will clothe you in incorruption and the woods on your bodies will shine in heaven like the stars.”

These words can hardly be considered the sage advice of a mother to her daughters, or are they? These words are exactly what the mother of three daughters said to them prior to their being martyred for Christ.

Living in Rome during the second century was not an easy thing for Christians. They were being tortured for refusing her three daughters, Faith, Hope, and Agape. It is not often that we find a mother who sacrificed herself and her three children in the name of Jesus Christ. We may even think that this story should not be shared with our families and yet, it is a dynamic revelation about a family united in Christ Jesus. The spiritual accomplishments of this family reveal that our Christian Orthodox Faith can exceed every aspect of worldly cares and bring us to the enjoyment of eternal blessings.

Sophia and her three daughters were recognized in the Christian community for their deep devotion and dedication to the worship services. Having joined fellow stewards in the candlelight of the catacombs, the worship experience strengthened Sophia and her lovely daughters during a violent period of Christian persecutions. This was a period when the Roman authorities viewed the Christians as a threat to their society. The Emperor Hadrian ordered his soldiers to gather all the Christians in Rome. Among those arrested were Sophia and her three daughters. No one could have imagined the harm that was to come to the three young girls aged twelve, ten, and nine. As Sophia and the children stood before the magistrate, the mother was challenged to deny Christ or suffer the torturing of her children. Sophia pleaded with the judge to release her children and that she would suffer the decision of the court. The children, as if with one voice, assured their mother that they would remain faithful to the Lord. One by one the girls were tortured before the eyes of their mother. With each sacrifice came greater praise and glory to the Heavenly King. When all three girls lay dead, their mother was dragged to their side where she prayed for the repose of their souls. Released by the Roman authorities, Sophia took her daughters and buried them. She remained by their graveside for three days and nights, and then retired her soul to God to be reunited with her saintly daughters in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Christian martyrdom was a real issue for the early Church. The example of St. Sophia and her three daughters is a genuine act of faith that involved extreme physical and moral sufferings. The gift of faith that St. Sophia instilled in her daughters, Faith, Hope, and Agape commands our respect and remembrance. We may not face such extreme torturing for Christ and His Church, but we must be steadfast in living our faith. We are called to have the same conviction of faith that St. Sophia and her daughters possessed. This conviction should be expressed in good Stewardship by each and every one of us. The gifts that these martyred saints offered were their very lives; the gifts we offer to the Lord will be our Time, Talents, and Treasure!

Congratulations! And, thank you again for all your hard work. The 2007 Greek Food Festival was a resounding success. We set new records on attendance, overall sales in our food booths and smiles on the faces of our guests!



Attendance for the weekend exceeded 8,700! A new record! That is a 27% increase over our 2006 attendance. And, if you were wondering, we counted the free entry coupons: 303 senior coupons, 1,685 e-tickets from our website and 1,322 free entrance coupons. A special thank you to Penny Hatzis and her Savannah High School volunteers who handed out flyers at Walmart over the weekend. Great Job!!!

The food booths set new sales records too! The Lamb Taverna sales increased 77% over 2006. The Gyro Booth increased 41% and the Soulvaki Booth increased 38%. The Hall Food increased 20% and Pastries increased 10%. On Sunday night, the gross sales for the weekend were over \$214,000! A new record! And, when we add all our income sources (ad book, vendor booths, etc), our total gross income for the Festival is \$280,000!



The Festival Committee continued working during the summer to process invoices, review comments and suggestions and finalize the financial report. We are happy to report that our net income is over \$138,000. Another new record!

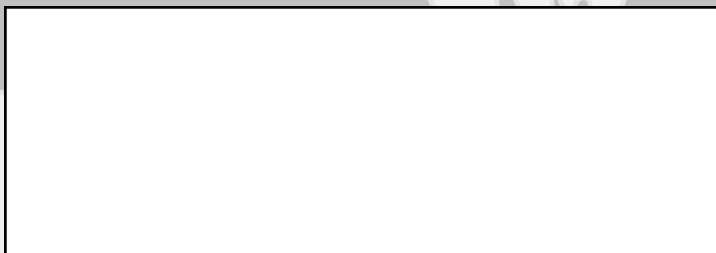
