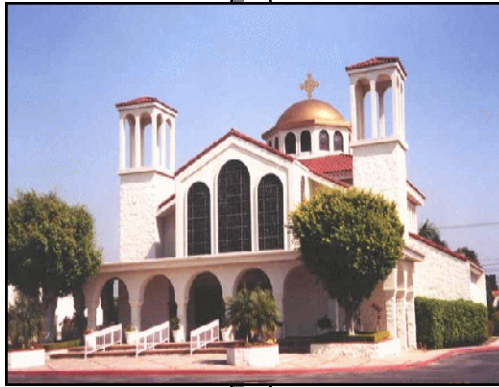
THE WORTH OF EVERY HUMAN BEING

In a world where power and wealth are the overriding quest of most, there are far too many people who are struggling to provide for themselves and their families with menial jobs. Thus the chasm between the have's and the have nots is increasing at a frightening pace.

In our every day struggles to do the best we can for self and family, we find ourselves separated from those who have been relegated to an inferior status. The usual critique is well known. They are lazy; they have inferior intellect, they are uneducated, they are happy where they are at and so forth.

In my recent lengthy hospitalization I was constantly and acutely aware of my dependence upon a large number of people, some professionals others with minimal skills. Without their combined service, I the patient could not have been brought back to health. The many doctors who attended, their assistants, the nurses and their assistants, the dieticians and those who served us our food, those who swept the floor, made the beds, and the strong muscular men who picked me up from the bed to the wheelchair. And let us not forget the physical therapists at home and away. I can go on and on. I express my gratitude to all of these and those I

failed to mention. But where would I be without the great support I received and continue to receive from three other precious souls; my dear and patient wife Helen and my two boys who would stay up all night for two months ministering to me, most of the time sleeping in a cot in my room shuffling from Yorba Linda and Sacramento to San Francisco and San Jose.



All this has humbled me greatly. It has made me aware that we are indebted to each other more than we can imagine. Whatever we may have attained through hard work we also owe to others. The anonymous many who do not get any of the credit are always the forgotten ones and are rarely recognized or rewarded. Yet, patiently they continue to serve us according to the demands

placed upon them..

Friends, as the followers of Christ we are called to treat each other with dignity, no matter our standing. We must not look down on people who are not as educated as we are or who work at jobs that we would never touch. Rather we should do all we can to make them feel their worth. Are they not worthy of our love, compassion and concern? These people perform the work that we feel is below our dignity. Consider the maids who pick up

The Church is a microcosm of society. We have members with all types of abilities. We owe much even to the least of these. A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JAMES

Dear Members,

Now that we have entered a new Church year (September 1) and a new School year, I want to share with you some personal concerns in hope that we will all work together to serve the needs of our members, young and seniors.

I am concerned in great measure about the future of this parish. While we have many (God bless them with many years) who participate in the various ministries and programs of our beloved parish, there are also many who are apathetic to the Church's call to get involved. These dear members are always ready with different excuses for their non-involvement even poking fun at those who give of their time, talents and treasure. The end result is that they become convinced that the Church and its ministries are not all that important so why get involved. What other conclusion is there? Apathy is rampant and attitudes against the Church are on the increase. Every single Christian Church leadership sees the problem. And many are doing their best to "fight the good fight".

Our Church teaches us that we are the Body of Christ. Seen from this perspective, all those who have been baptized and chrismated in the Orthodox Church are a vital part of our Church. In fact, they are the Ecclesia, i.e. the Church. The Church is not the building but its members. Thus we need to understand that the Church is us. We have an important stake in our parish. For without us members there is no Church.

As members of the Church (and no one forces this membership on us) we must be ACTIVE members. We need to become involved together with our family. To refuse to participate does not honor us. It can even become a denial of Jesus Christ himself. Attendance at worship is paramount. We are called to GROW in Christ. Without participation in worship (latreia) we cannot grow and we remain stymied. Our Church through the sacraments leads us on the path to salvation.

I've wondered many times what would happen to our Church, our parish, if the membership continued to decrease. Look what has happened in Turkey. Hundreds of Churches have been shut down, and those few which remained open only a dozen or so attend the Liturgy.

I would like to ask those who are apathetic to our Church and its programs/ministries how would they feel if our parish of St. John were to start decreasing in membership and eventually be forced to close down.

Unthinkable? It has happened. And it can happen to any parish where its members don't really care for the church and they don't work together to promote its well being.

I remember some years back in my former position I had a conversation with a man who although was in the area more than fifteen years, he never pledged anything in support of the church. When I confronted him with that he used the excuse that he was in this country temporarily. I then asked him how he would feel if on Great Friday when he would come to church, there was no church. He looked at me and with a very forlorn look said in Greek (aschima) that is, bad. And I continued, you would feel bad on two counts: 1) You would not be able to worship the dead Lord and receive the blessings of the Crucifixion but 2) you would feel like a man without an identity since there would be no gathering of fellow Greek Orthodox which served to make you realize you are part of a greater family.

The Holy Gospel represents Christ. After the completion of the Great Synapte, following the reading of the characteristic prayer “Master Lord our God, You have appointed in Heaven orders and hosts of angels and archangels to minister to Your glory. As we make our entrance, let there also be an entrance of holy angels, serving with us and together glorifying Your goodness. For all honor and worship befit You, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and always and to the ages of ages, Amen”



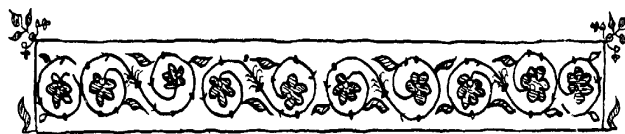
The Holy Gospel is taken out to the middle of the solea by the priest or deacon, and raised up high. The Hierarch or priest then blesses the entrance of the Holy Entrance with the words “Blessed is the Entrance of your Saints”. St. Maximos the Confessor explains it in this way: “After completing the Great Synapti, the first entrance generally represents the first appearance of Christ”. An older Father of the church, whose writings are cited by St Maximos, states that when a Hierarch is present during the small entrance, it is symbolic of “The Incarnate Word making its appearance in the world.”

As the Holy Gospel is taken to the middle of the solea, accompanied by lighted torches and the Cross, the Priest or Deacon proclaims the words “Sophia Orthoi” or “Wisdom! Arise!” Whatever occurs in the Temple is sealed with the sign of the Cross, whether it is at the beginning of the Divine Liturgy, where the sigh of the Cross is made over the Holy Alter Table, with the Holy Gospel, or when a prayer is recited over an individual by the Hierarch or Priest.

It should be the same in our lives. Our every action and endeavor should be proceeded by the making of the sigh of the Cross. Having entered the New Ecclesiastical Year (As of September 1st) let us make a firm commitment to “Commend ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ our God”

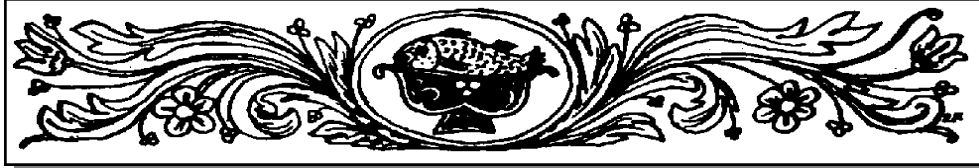

The Stewardship of St. John Koukouzelis

October 1



Christian Orthodox Stewardship is a practice that is often misunderstood and misused in the Church. Many think of Stewardship solely from a monetary perspective, as a means to financially support the sacred work of the Church. This is, of course, important, but Stewardship should not be limited to this - it is much more!

Christian Orthodox stewards are taught to give their Time, Talents, and Treasure to the glory of God. There are many opportunities in parish life that enable us to support the Lord's work. It is a sacred privilege for each of us to participate in the life of the Church. We pledge ourselves to the Lord so that our offerings may be faithful and obedient to His teachings and the Sacred Traditions of our Christian Orthodox Faith.

Among the many ways we can participate in our parish ministries is as a chanter, a reader, or member of the choir. We emulate the angelic choirs in heaven when we sing to the glory of God. There are also a number of saints whose example we follow by managing our Time and using our musical Talent to sing to the Lord. Among them are: St. Romanos the Melodist, St. John of Damascus, St. Andrew of Crete, Joseph the Hymnographer, and St. Kassiane. There is also another saint who is known for his love

for the music of our Church, a pious man who possessed a marvelous voice, and a steward of the Faith who gave his Time and Talent to the glory of God. Who was the person? St. John Koukouzelis!

As a young man, St. Koukouzelis was recognized for his musical talent. He was sent to the Conservatory of Music in Constantinople, where he became a popular singer for the Imperial Court. The success he enjoyed as an entertainer for the Emperor and his court should have given him every satisfaction, but John was not content with his life. He was concerned about the flattery and praise brought upon him for his musical talent and felt that his voice was not being used for its real purpose. John knew that the Emperor would never allow him to leave his position, so he fled to the Holy Mountain to search his soul and to pray to God for guidance. The Emperor became concerned about the disappearance of his favorite singer and offered a reward to anyone who could give him information about him.

At the Great Lavra Monastery, John did not reveal who he was or what position he had held in the Imperial Court. He simply wanted to be a shepherd and monk. While taking care of the flock, John would sing hymns to the Lord and to the Theotokos. One day, a couple of monks heard him singing with a voice so sweet and melodic that they thought that it was that of an angel. They moved quietly, hoping to see the vision of an angel but instead they saw John with his flock. The monks rushed back to the monastery and told the abbot what they had heard and seen. When John returned, he was summoned by the abbot who asked him why he was not willing to use his voice during the divine services. John explained his story to him, but the abbot assured him that the Emperor would understand and accept his desire to pursue the monastic life. The abbot instructed him to never hide the Talent that God had given him, but to use it to praise and glorify the His Almighty Name. From that moment on, John served as the lead chanter in the monastery. As the Akathist Hymn was being sung during Great Lent one year, John was exhausted and sat down and fell asleep near the icon of the Holy Mother of God and soon fell asleep. The Theotokos appeared to him and said: ***"Greetings, John! Sing, and don't stop singing; and for this, I will never leave you."*** She then placed a gold coin into his hand and disappeared. John woke up immediately, and in his hand was the gold coin.

The life of St. John Koukouzelis is an example of how important it is to manage our Time so that we may use our Talents properly. We have all been entrusted with blessings from God, and He desires that we put them to good use. Take a moment from your busy schedule and ask yourself: "Am I managing God's blessings as a good and faithful steward?" May St. John Koukouzelis intercede on your behalf and be an inspiration so that you use your Talents for the glory of God.
