PAIN



It is 5:00am and I am in the hospital experiencing severe pain.

No one likes to be in pain. Yet pain can serve us as a powerful tool, which alerts the patient that something is wrong with his body that the medical people may attend to its needs.

Yes, it would be a great mistake to look at pain in purely negative terms, as something to be avoided at all costs. For without pain, we would be in serious trouble.

God's gift of pain, yes it is a gift, benefits us in many ways. It allows us to pause and to seriously consider those things which truly matter in our life. Pain can often point to the direction our life should take. Pain can make us acutely aware of whether or not we live our life for the right reasons. It acts as a catalyst, the gadfly of Socrates, which awakens us to the reality of another world, the world of the spirit, the place where God dwells.

Pain serves to remind me of simpler days when things were more innocent but also points out to the wrong ways I have chosen. Pain may be pointing me down another way. Pain could be also trying to tell me that I need to re-examine my relationships with others and especially with God. Yes, all this time in pain, God may be whispering to me. Think about it.

Pain may awaken me to make radical changes. Pain can be physical or non-physical. Often times, the results of life's struggles to succeed provides us with some satisfaction but this satisfaction is short-lived. This may lead us to wrongly conclude that, that's true happiness. Some will never be able to make changes to rid them of this false security of hoping in "more and more". One story points out to what I am saying. There was a man by the name of Alfred Nobel. He was extremely wealthy and lived the good life. One day he awoke to the shock of his life. In big bold letters, he saw in the local newspaper his obituary with the tag line, "Alfred Nobel the inventor of dynamite which brought misery to the world, is dead." Shocked by the pain of what he would be remembered for, he marshaled his forces and made changes in his will and formed many foundations to assist humanity. And he is remembered as the founder of the Annual Nobel Peace Prize and other awards. Such is the power of pain. It can bring about great healing of body, soul and spirit.

I need to ask myself, is my faith grounded in Jesus Christ and my Orthodox Christian faith? Is the Lord Jesus someone I long for as the, "physician of our souls and bodies", or the one who is my very life? Can he be both? Absolutely, He is.

Friends, if Christ is not your life, if you don't feel goose bumps because every time you receive Him in your mouth, you have some serious work ahead of you. Your physical pain can assist you to turn from your bed of pain to Christ, the most compassionate truth. Yes pain can bring you a timely conversion. It can offer you a world of opportunities. Do it while your window is still opened.

Are you finally ready? Go for it!!!

THE SATIATION OF OUR HUNGER

God has armed us with certain instincts which motivate each of us to concern ourselves with not simply maintaining ourselves, physically, as well as spiritually, but also to constantly try to improve the quality of our life. The miracle of the multiplication of the fives loaves of bread as well as the two fish affords us an opportunity to focus on one of these instincts, that is the instinct of hunger.

First of all, the instinct of hunger is necessary for the survival of the human race. If we do not eat, we will die within a short period of time.

From the moment that we arrive into this world, until the moment we leave, all humans demonstrate the need to survive in various ways. The first manner in which we demonstrate our need to survive, following our birth, is through crying. When a baby is hungry, it cries. It immediately attracts the attention of the parents, in order that the baby may be fed, thus satisfying one of it's most basic needs. If this need is not met, the baby can experience serious health complications, eventually leading to it's death.

Additionally, human beings experience other types of hunger. Specifically, each of us has both emotional and psychological needs which must be satisfied beginning at an early age.

Some of these needs include, but are not limited to a need to feel safe, as well as a need to belong and be accepted. In 1943 the psychologist Abraham Maslow expounded on these needs in a paper entitled A Theory of Human Motivation.

There is also another, deeper need that human beings need to satisfy. That is the need to know God. Not simply to know him in theory, but to have a very personal relationship with Him.

Since the expulsion of mankind from the Garden of Eden, mankind had been progressively moving further away from God. In the Old Testament, we read how God had sent the various prophets in an effort to motivate people to return back to Him. His infinite love for mankind, God conducts one final effort to bring people back to Him by sending His Only Begotten Son, Jesus Christ, who was subsequently crucified for the sins of the world.

During His three year earthly ministry, Jesus spoke to the people teaching them about God, thereby fulfilling their inherit need to better know God. Additionally, He performed a multitude of miracles, often utilizing common materials, such as fish, wine, bread and oil as well as curing people from illness and even raising people from the dead, in order to demonstrate His Divine Essence. With regard to Christ satisfying both the physical as well as spiritual needs of mankind, St. John Chrysostom writes the following with regard to Christ feeding the five thousand. "The hour has passed, but He, who is not subjected to time, speaks with you." Following this miracle the people flocked to Christ in order to learn the truth about God. Their spiritual hunger to know God was so great that they, and countless others, followed Christ wherever He went.

What about us? Are we hungry to know God? Just what are we realistically willing to do to satisfy this spiritual hunger? What time and what efforts are we willing to devote to better knowing God? What are we realistically willing to sacrifice to achieve this goal? Or are we just kidding ourselves? How high is this on our priority list?

The New Ecclesiastical Year, which began on September 1st affords us yet another opportunity to "recharge" our spiritual life, through participation in the various ministries of our church in order to help us achieve this goal. Don't allow yet another opportunity to pass by. Now is the time to rededicate our lives back to God. Let us take advantage of this opportunity as we don't really know if we will ever get another one.

The Stewardship of St. John Koukouzelis October 1



Christian Orthodox Stewardship is a practice that is often misunderstood and misused in the Church. Many think of Stewardship solely from a monetary perspective, as a means to financially support the sacred work of the Church. This is, of course, important, but Stewardship should not be limited to this - it is much more!

Christian Orthodox stewards are taught to give their Time, Talents, and Treasure to the glory of God. There are many opportunities in parish life that enable us to support the Lord's work. It is a sacred privilege for each of us to participate in the life of the Church. We pledge ourselves to the Lord so that our offerings may be faithful and obedient to His teachings and the Sacred Traditions of our Christian Orthodox Faith.

Among the many ways we can participate in our parish ministries is as a chanter, a reader, or member of the choir. We emulate the angelic choirs in heaven when we sing to the glory of God. There are also a number of saints whose example we follow by managing our Time and using our musical Talent to sing to the Lord. Among them are: St. Romanos the Melodist,

St. John of Damascus, St. Andrew of Crete, Joseph the Hymnographer, and St. Kassiane. There is also another saint who is known for his love for the music of our Church, a pious man who possessed a marvelous voice, and a steward of the Faith who gave his Time and Talent to the glory of God. Who was the person? St. John Koukouzelis!

As a young man, St. Koukouzelis was recognized for his musical talent. He was sent to the Conservatory of Music in Constantinople, where he became a popular singer for the Imperial Court. The success he enjoyed as an entertainer for the Emperor and his court should have given him every satisfaction, but John was not content with his life. He was concerned about the flattery and praise brought upon him for his musical talent and felt that his voice was not being used for its real purpose. John knew that the Emperor would never allow him to leave his position, so he fled to the Holy Mountain to search his soul and to pray to God for guidance. The Emperor became concerned about the disappearance of his favorite singer and offered a reward to anyone who could give him information about him.

At the Great Lavra Monastery, John did not reveal who he was or what position he had held in the Imperial Court. He simply wanted to be a shepherd and monk. While taking care of the flock, John would sing hymns to the Lord and to the Theotokos. One day, a couple of monks heard him singing with a voice so sweet and melodic that they thought that it was that of an angel. They moved quietly, hoping to see the vision of an angel but instead they saw John with his flock. The monks rushed back to the monastery and told the abbot what they had heard and seen. When John returned, he was summoned by the abbot who asked him why he was not willing to use his voice during the divine services. John explained his story to him, but the abbot assured him that the Emperor would understand and accept his desire to pursue the monastic life. The abbot instructed him to never hide the Talent that God had given him, but to use it to praise and glorify His Almighty Name. From that moment on, John served as the lead chanter in the monastery. As the Akathist Hymn was being sung during Great Lent one year, John was exhausted and sat down and fell asleep near the icon of the Holy Mother of God and soon fell asleep. The Theotokos appeared to him and said: "Greetings, John! Sing, and don't stop singing; and for this, I will never leave you." She then placed a gold coin into his hand and disappeared. John woke up immediately, and in his hand was the gold coin.

The life of St. John Koukouzelis is an example of how important it is to manage our Time so that we may use our Talents properly. We have all been entrusted with blessings from God, and He desires that we put them to good use. Take a moment from your busy schedule and ask yourself: "Am I managing God's blessings as a good and faithful steward?" May St. John Koukouzelis intercede on your behalf and be an inspiration so that you use your Talents for the glory of God.

ACOLYTES


